

THE SPRING 2025 PROGRAM PLANNING LIST

Below, you'll find the Spring 2025 courses that satisfy the requirements for the architecture majors and minor. Please refer to the 'Distribution' column, along with our notes below, to determine which specific requirement(s) each course can fulfill. For the most up-to-date course information, please refer to The Directory of Classes. To view previous versions of our program planning lists, please visit our website.

Here are the notations used in this document for the major and minor distribution requirements:

- **STUDIO:** Course fulfills one of the 'Studio' requirements for the major or minor
- **MODERN:** Course fulfills the 'Modern Architecture in the World' course requirement from the *Lectures, Seminars, and Workshops* category
- **HIST:** Course fulfills the 'Architectural Elective: History' requirement from the *Lectures, Seminars and Workshops* category
- **SEG:** Course fulfills the 'Architectural Elective: Society, Environment, and the Global' requirement from the *Lectures, Seminars, and Workshops* category
- **DMT:** Course fulfills the 'Architectural Elective: Design, Media, and Technology' requirement from the *Lectures, Seminars, and Workshops* category
- **ELEC:** Course fulfills the 'Architectural Elective' requirement from the *Lectures, Seminars, and Workshops* category
- **SR SEM:** Course fulfills the 'Senior Seminar' requirement from the *Senior Courses* category
- **SR ELEC:** Course fulfills the 'Senior Architecture Elective' requirement from the *Senior Courses* category

Below are some additional notes:

- All architecture courses listed in the 'Lectures, Seminars, and Workshops' category can be used as an Architectural Elective (ELEC) for the majors or minor.
- Senior Seminars are only open to architecture majors in their senior year, or, if graduating early, during their final two semesters before graduation.
- Courses taken to fulfill the 'Senior Architecture Elective' requirement for the major must be taken during the senior year and can include any of the following:
 - A second Senior Seminar in the Architecture Department
 - A 4,000-level bridge seminar offered by the the Architecture Department
 - Advanced Architectural Research & Design
 - An Independent Study for 4 academic credits, with the approval of your major advisor and the Chair
 - A course offered by GSAPP that is designated as a 'Senior Architecture Elective' on our 'B+C|A List of GSAPP Courses Approved for our Majors and Minor' list
- Courses for the 'Specialization' category of the major requirements are not necessarily listed here. After declaring the major, students will work with their major advisors to develop a description of their specialization, along with a title for the focus area. Advisors will then approve the corresponding course selections, which may be derived from this list or may come from elsewhere, depending on the area of specialization. While students are welcome to develop alternative specializations with their advisor's approval, majors are generally encouraged to focus on one of the following categories: History; Society, Environment, and the Global; or Design, Media, and Technology.
